### One way we define Integrity is through the Mission Awards Integrity Criteria

- 1. Discloses adverse events in an open, transparent and safe environment or fosters a safe environment for others to do so.
- 2. Is willing to listen and speak out when needed to prevent or resolve ethical conflict.
- 3. Takes responsibility for their own words and actions without blaming others.
- 4. Challenges plans or practices that could be harmful and works with others to find better options.
- 5. Honors their commitments so others see them as honest and trustworthy.
- 6. Responds to complaints promptly and respectfully and follows through with creative solutions.
- 7. Practices self-awareness and self-care so they can consistently provide highquality service.
