- 1. Uses resources responsibly, guided by Covenant's mission, values and strategic directions.
- 2. Seeks creative opportunities to increase efficiency and avoid waste.
- 3. Promotes environmental stewardship through recycling, energy conservation and other green initiatives.
- 4. Practices and promotes personal or team wellness so that work is effective and fulfilling.
- 5. Uses time effectively to focus on and accomplish what is most important in their role.
- 6. Models and promotes safe work practices to reduce injuries and sick time.
- 7. Stays current with and models best practices within their profession.
